INTRODUCTION

When we turn in our Bible to Luke 19, we read of a King and a conflict. This conflict, however, did not immediately involve weapons and armies, but it actually started in the hearts of those crowning Him. This King is Jesus, and His reign in the capital city of Jerusalem would last only five days, for less than a week later the inner conflict of his subjects gave way to betrayal and overthrow. From this coronation conflict, we learn that because this King is unlike any other King—indeed, ***because He is the divine King— we must _____ Him as Lord of our lives.***
