- Beginning of the 20th century Max Weber, one of the leaders of sociology, examined the essentials of successful capitalism why does it thrive in some places & not in others?
 - Adaption of vocation, hard work, personal piety led to economic success
 - Application of Biblical values to business resulted in economic success (successful capitalism)
- 1993 Dr. Douglas North won the Nobel Prize in Economics for his work in institutional economics.
 - He proved a direct link between the long-term economic development and certain "institutions" of a society.
 - Those were the formalized rules of its political/governmental system and the informal rules of its moral-cultural system.
- Summary: a society's economic performance are directly linked to its...
 - constitutions, laws and regulations
 - o morals, conventions, and social norms
 - There is shift taking place between codified standards and moral standards in the Western world
 - More codified/legal compelled behavior
 - Less ethical (compelled by "what is right") behavior
 - Self-interest (situational) standard versus Biblical (immutable) standard of morality
